Prairie Restoration Research Tour at Finley Refuge

Description: This is a tour of research conducted by the Institute For Applied Ecology in conjunction with The Nature Conservancy: “Regional Strategies for Restoring Invaded Prairies” (aka the Collins Project). We will be visiting two sites on Finley Refuge, showing the 5 year results of combinations of mowing, burning, herbicide, and native seeding. We may also have an opportunity to show reintroduction efforts for Golden Paintbrush, Kincaid’s Lupine, and Willamette Daisy.

Time/Date: Wed, June 17, 9:30AM-12:30PM

Directions: From 99W, turn West onto Bruce Rd (approximately 13 miles S of Corvallis/28 mi N of Eugene). There is a gas station on the corner. Follow Bruce Rd across the train tracks, onto Finley Refuge, and past wetlands. Just after the bridge, turn into a parking area on a slight rise on the left. We will meet at this parking area at 9:30 and carpool to the two sites.
