_____ I understand (and will inform other pertinent parties) that before my building permit can be approved I must submit:

1. the well log filed with the State
2. a water quality test showing acceptable levels of coliform bacteria and nitrates, done within the last 12 months
3. a pump flow test performed to County specifications and done within the past 12 months (some exceptions), showing adequate water supply

The exact requirements are explained on a County handout. **It is up to me or my designee to make sure the well testing professional I hire has read the requirements, understands them, and calls the County if unsure. It is up to me to make sure the necessary information is submitted.**

If the County recently approved a partition or subdivision for this land, I might not need to submit well information. I can ask a planner for details.

_____ I understand (and will inform other pertinent parties) that the plans may need to accommodate a storage tank of up to 1,500 gallons, if well flow is low.

_____ I understand (and will inform other pertinent parties) that:

- **If the well is unable to produce a sustained yield of at least 5 gallons per minute (with static water level for 4 hours) October 16 through July 14, retesting during the dry season might be necessary before the permit can be issued.**
- **If the well is unable to produce a sustained yield of at least 1 gallon per minute (with static water level for 4 hours) July 15 through October 15, the building permit will be denied.** If permit denial is due to failure to meet the code's water requirements, no refunds will be issued. The applicant/owner/contractor is proceeding at his/her own risk.

FOR ALL PERMITS
