I. Call to Order and Introductions

Meeting called to order at 5:15 pm by Lisa Pierson, Chair.

II. Approval of December 2016 Minutes

The December 2016 minutes were presented for approval.

Motion was made by Cunha to approve the December 2016 minutes as written. Mullins seconded the motion, so approved by unanimous vote.

III. Community Feedback and Announcements

Myhre

- Announced there is a cold weather shelter meeting tonight at the Corvallis Public Library starting at 6:30 pm.

Tripp

- Reported that he will be meeting with Representative Sara Gelser to provide feedback on People with Disabilities and the Federal Marriage Penalties.

Mullins

- The Samaritan detox facility in Lebanon will probably open in October; a medical director has been hired. At some point if MHADDAC would like more information on the facility, Mullins can approach the director to come and talk with the committee.

IV. New Business

State Hospital Potential Closure

At the last December meeting, Wolcott inquired on the potential closure of the state hospital located in Junction City and the impact of closure. Decision made to add this as an Agenda item when Anderson was present.

Anderson reported that currently the hospital has approximately 80 people, no Benton County individuals. The Benton County Board of Commissioners do not have authority on decision of closure; budget is at the state level.

V. Old Business

Election of Chair and Vice Chair Positions

Per the Bylaws, MHADDAC is required to nominate and elect the Chair and Vice Chair positions at the beginning of each year. Nominations were completed at the December meeting.

I. Call to Order and Introductions

Meeting called to order at 5:15 pm by Amy Young, Interim Chair. Introductions were done. Welcome new member Nicole Langpap.

II. Approval of August 2017 Minutes

The August 2017 minutes were presented for approval.

Motion was made by Giles to approve the August 2017 minutes as written. Tripp seconded the motion, so approved by unanimous vote.

III. Community Feedback and Announcements

Tripp -

- Reported that the homeless shelter will operate for one year only for this winter. Location of the shelter is in South Corvallis.

Cunha –

- Inquired if the Health levy coming up would benefit Benton County Health Department. Jasper answered, yes; it is a Health and Safety Levy that funds some positions at the Health Department.

Brown –

- Started working as the Benton County Mental Health Division Manager about one month ago. She came from Klamath Falls and is excited to be working with Benton County. Brown has lots of experience working with adults who have serve and persistent mental illness and crisis work.

Peterson –

- Briefed new committee members on the Ombudsman program; and shared updates.
 - Covers the whole state – Benton County is one of her counties that she covers, as well as, Klamath Falls.
 - They visit and advocate for individuals in licensed homes and developmental diversity homes.

- There is a great need for more licensed homes in the county.
- Busy working to get everything in place for their volunteer program.
- Visits are unannounced.
- Giles said there are 3 different programs out of that office:
 - Oregon Public Guardian Program
 - Approximately 15,000 people in Oregon who will need a guardian through the courts.
 - Volunteer and Care Ombudsman Program
 - Approximately 7,600 mental health and developmental diversity homes.
 - Long Term Care Program
 - Approximately 44,000 beds in the state that they try to look at from a resident point of view.

Shandy –

- Announced that the 2nd Annual Appreciate and Recruitment Night put on by the Board of Commissioners office is on Thursday, September 21st from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm at the Gerber Hall at the Benton County Fairgrounds. Dinner will be provide and encouraged to bring a friend who might want to join a committee. The Board of Commissioners office would like a representative from each committee to provide a 2 – 3 minute presentation on their mission. Also a table top display was suggested.
- Young asked committee members to provide 1-2 sentences on their background and/or why they are interested in the committee. Shandy will email members for response.

Young –

- Shared handouts on smoking cessation work for people with mental illness and developmental diversity. Email will be sent out with links to articles.

V. Old Business

Strategic Planning

Representatives who were scheduled to attend today's meeting to provide overview on Community Health Assessment/Community Health Plan and the Stepping Up - Jail Diversion and work with break out sub-committees were not in attendance. The briefing and break-out work will be tabled for the next meeting, October 2017.

The committee used this time for discussion. The following information was captured:

- *Giles and Langpap will join the Outreach and Engagement Sub-Committee*
- Huff Meyer, Sergeant for the State Police Department, University Patrol is in attendance today. He was invited by Jay Vandenberggaard to start taking part in

MHADDAC. Here is here to learn, how can help, and work together. Meyer provided the following information:

- There are 10 troopers assigned on campus, with 24/7 coverage. Stretched thin at times.
- Oregon State University (OSU) – “no trespassing” by certain individuals is a decision by the university not the police department.
 - University Patrol enforces OSU’s decision.
 - Depending upon the situation, might only give a ticket with a court date or will take into custody if people are feeling threatened by the individuals actions/activities.
 - Works with the OSU Care Team, which meets weekly. There is representatives from student conduct, safety, counseling, student health center, etc. They all work together to find the best strategy to help the individual.
 - Smith stated that there is similar community committee – Vulnerable Adult Service Team (VAST). Meyer will check to see if they are part of this committee and if not, how to become a participant.
 - Troopers called for a welfare consideration, will assess the situation and make a log entry. This entry is not a public entry; any mental health concern is not available to the press unless a records request is submitted.
- Brown reported the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training will be happening the week of September 11th with the Corvallis Police Department. It is designed to create a bridge for all to speak the same language when dealing with those in mental health crisis.
- Committee members asked Brown to bring jail diversion data at the next meeting, October 3rd for discussion.

Nomination and Election of Chair Position

An email will go out to committee members, asking if anyone is interested in the Chair position until January. If no interest, Young will consider being interim Chair until January.

I. Call to Order and Introductions

II. Approval of September 2017 Minutes

III. Community Feedback and Announcements

Myhre -

- Renovation for the homeless shelter is taking place.
- Housing Opportunities Action Council (HOAC) website has job positions posted if anyone is interested.
- Corvallis Housing First is providing case management services at the shelter.
- HOAC had a meeting a few weeks ago about forming a mental health committee. Anyone interested in these meetings can contact Myhre.

Young –

- Asked for information on the Health Levy and how that impacts the Health Department. Barnworth said that this is a 5 year levy that is up for renewal in November. This levy funds his position (Epidemiologist), Children's Mental Health, and Communicable Disease program for Health Services in addition to Law Enforcement/Sheriff's Department programs and staff. A reminder that as a committee member you can't advocate for the levy; however, as a private citizen you can

Giles –

- Asked how the Office of Developmental Disability Services (ODDS) changes will impact the county/developmental diversity population. Smith said the state cuts are regional; however, Benton County will not see significant changes. Most effected will be Eastern Oregon and Coastal Counties.

- Suggested to have a representative come to a MHADDAC meeting to talk about “legislative days”.

Vandenbogaard -

- Provided feedback on the 2nd Annual Advisory Board & Committee Recognition & Recruitment Night. Overall it was a good event. Helen Cunha was present and spoke for MHADDAC. It was noted that other advisories used the opportunity to announce/solicit for open position on their rosters.

V. Old Business

Strategic Planning

Sherry Sullens is in attendance today to provide information on Stepping Up – Jail Diversion, and Peter Banwarth, for an overview of the Community Health Assessment.

Stepping Up – Jail Diversion - Sullens

- Solid team – the program is now called Jail Outreach instead of Jail Diversion
- Goal of program is to reduce recidivism, keep individuals from going in and out of jail
- In-reach to the Benton County, Lincoln, and Yamhill jails.
- Outreach locations include Drop-in Center, Corvallis Public Library, Central Park, homeless camps, etc.
- Partnering with law enforcement to provide Crisis Intervention Trainings (CIT)
 - Suggestion was made by MHADDAC to provide trainings for school districts

Community Health Assessment / Community Health Improvement Plan (CHA/CHIP) – Banwarth

- Anderson handed out the CHA at a previous meeting for members to review
- Previous CHA had Behavioral Health wrapped into the sections; this time around it is separated out into its own section
- A short section of hate crimes data was recently added to the CHA
 - Current data reflects hate crimes only when an arrest took place that meet certain criteria.
- Community Health Assessment informs the Community Health Improvement Plan.
- Data used to prioritize the issues
- Benton County is currently doing the 2040 Thriving Initiative process

Committee members broke out into the Stepping Up/Jail Diversion and CHA/CHIP sub-committees. Members regrouped after 20 minutes to provide a 2 minute report out. The following information was captured:

CHA/CHIP

- Reviewed the draft CHA
- Community involvement component of providing feedback on the document and how it is going to relate to the Community Health Improvement Plan will start happening in November
- Outreach to agencies
- Be aware of what is going on, participate, and help promote

Stepping Up / Jail Diversion

- How to access Jail Diversion team
- Communication strategies
- Communication to volunteer regarding to resources
- Police department brings clients to the shelter
- Crisis intervention training – Mental Health First Aide
- Daytime drop in Center
- How to work with Seriously and Persistent Mentally Ill (SPMI) population - Point of contacts for resolving crisis
- How does the Jail Diversion interact with Law Enforcement
- OSU
- Future interactions – trainings in Mental Health First Aide for variety of agencies, such as Drop in Center

Young asked the committee members to familiarize with the language and framework of the 2040 Thriving Communities Initiative before the next meeting.

Young asked if anyone was interested in the Chair position until January. There was no response. Young will continue as the Chair until the next election – January 2018
