SUBJECT: No Spray Program

The Benton County Public Works Department will begin its Annual Roadside Shoulder Spraying Program to control vegetation along County roads starting in April (weather permitting).

In order to increase public safety and decrease deterioration of the road, certain restrictions apply to roadside activity. The attached diagram will help identify what is permissible within 2.5 feet of the edge of the road. Please note that no vegetation is permitted within the first 6 inches of the edge of pavement. This allows water to flow off the pavement onto the gravel shoulder without allowing it to pool at the edge, decreasing deterioration of the road structure. Be aware that the County may spray vegetation that is encroaching on or within 6 inches of the pavement without advance notice.

In the past you have elected to enter into an annual “No Spray Agreement” with the County. If you elect to continue participating, please take a few moments to read through the enclosed materials and complete the agreement form. If you would like a modified spray program (spraying for noxious weeds, but not roadside grasses) please call my office to make arrangements. **Please check your signs for visibility and proper installation. Signs must be posted by March 15, 2019.**

Please return the completed agreement to the address above no later than March 15, 2019. If the County does not receive your signed agreement, your property will be removed from the “No Spray Program.” You may also notify us by phone if you no longer wish to participate.
